Despite the accolades, though, every time Ellison received another prize for "Invisible Man" he had to face the inevitable question: where was his second novel? The move to Plainfield, in 1967, with his wife, Fanny, was supposed to provide him with an environment in which to finish the book, later titled "Juneteenth." It is uncertain how much of the book had been written when it was lost, but the tragedy became the defining event of the latter part of Ellison's life. Ellison had an American penchant for complaint. Born on March 1, 1913, he was the second son of Lewis and Ida Ellison. (Their first, Alfred, had died in infancy. Ellison's younger brother, Herbert, was born in 1916.)
